

World AIDS Day Theme Influences Second Issue

On December 05, 1997 Paraguay released its second stamp issue pertaining to AIDS. This issue reflected the "Children Living in a World with AIDS" theme for World AIDS Day 1997 in a unique way by having the designs of the two stamps created by children themselves! Both the 500g and 1000g values also carry the globally recognized Red Ribbon and WHO symbol. Paraguay's first AIDS issue was 04 May 1995.




Fig. 7 - ITALY Issued by ANLAIDS as a set of 3 cards. Expires 06.98. (3rd card missing!). L5,000;L10,000 and L20,000 values.

Fig. 9 - NETHERLANDS Issued to promote use of condoms and safe sex. Not dated.






Fig. 10 - USA Issued two different phonecards. One (left) was a reproduction of the USA red ribbon postage stamp and dated 1993. The second (right) offers information about AIDS and HIV testing. It expires 2.28.99

DETAILS

No doubt most AIDS topical collectors will have the Guyana overprint set of thirteen "butterfly" stamps as part of their collection. Interestingly, there are actually only **five** different values in the set; the two revalued denominations (\$5 and \$10 to 120) were overprinted with five different AIDS awareness slogans.

Upon examining full mint sheets (25 stamps per sheet) of this issue, we discover the significant layout to accommodate the overprinting.

Because of the sheets being comprised of 25 stamps one might obtain either a vertical or horizontal strip of the five different overprinted slogans, depending on how the sheets were detatched!





Left: Vertical strip


Right: Horizontal strip

For the corner block collector this presents a problem in that any blocks of four will infact be missing one of the five AIDS awareness slogans and will include one of the slogans twice. The ideal solution would be to try to obtain the full sheets of 25 stamps! (Last year a dealer offered me a complete set (5) of mint sheets of this issue for \$1500.US, however I graceously declined.

POSTCARD PURSUIT

Singapores' Action For AIDS organization has put out several interesting postcards directed specifically to encourage the use of condoms as a means of practicing safer sex. We include five different ones here which very clearly get the message across.
