ISSUES UPDATE A TO Z

WALLIS & FUTUNA has issued a second AIDS awareness stamp for World AIDS Day; it was issued on December 01, 1998. The design is intriguing in that it raises the question of just how much of a puzzle AIDS (SIDA) still is. (Graphic not available at this time)

MACEDONIA continues its AIDS awareness stamp issue policy with its 5th World AIDS Day issue since 1994. It is our understanding that they plan to continue this practice to at least 2000. We regret that we have not yet received a graphic of this issue.









FRANCE continues its campaign of AIDS awareness with a variety of boxed slogan cancels promoting AIDS Information Services free of charge 24 hours a day by using a toll free number. This "generic" type cancel is used in a reported 30 or more postal sites throughout France.


The following chart illustrates by year the number of countries and actual number of stamps issued relating to HIV/AIDS:


However, when taking a second look at the statistics above it would appear that fewer countries are releasing fewer stamps per issue.
