

SOUTH AFRICA

On April 01, 1999 the South African Post Office (Philatelic Services) issued this attractive AIDS Awareness Booklet which contains five sets of two se-tenant standard rate postage stamps. Each stamp depicts the Red Ribbon crafted into the "loveletter" in red beads against a white background and either green or blue backdrop. The booklet carries AIDS awareness information both inside and out.

ISSUES UPDATE A TO Z





Of particular interest, and to my curiosity, I am showing here a booklet pane that has been cancelled "PRETORIA" 1999-04-01. However, I did not request this when placing my order and the rest were NOT cancelled!

Could this be a rarity? or a CTO? RSA does not issue FDCovers for booklet stamps!





Of further interest to this South African issue, (as we reported in the last issue of the AOS Newsletter), is an earlier booklet of 10 "Standard Rate Stamps" featuring the rhino, both on the stamps and cover of the booklet as shown above. However, the inside of this particular booklet crries the same AIDS awareness information as is included in the AIDS stamp issue (opposite).

MALAYASIA has just issued a set of three stamps (we do not have copies yet!) on June 19, 1999 commemorating the Fifth International Congress on AIDS being held there. The set consists of 3 values; 30¢, 50¢, and \$1. We hope to have obtained these for our next Newsletter issue.


